9.90.005 Statutes incorporated by reference. The provisions of the following state statutes are incorporated by reference in this chapter:

- RCW 9.68A.150 Allowing a Minor on Minor on Premises of Live Erotic Performance; Allowing Minors to Enter and Remain in Certain Adult Establishments;
- RCW 26.28.080 Selling a Minor Tobacco Products, and Selling a Minor Firearms; and
- RCW 70.155.080 Purchasing, possessing, or obtaining tobacco by persons under the age of 18.

9.90.010 Leaving Children Under Age Seven (7) in a Parked Vehicle.

- A. No person, while in charge of a motor vehicle, shall park or willfully allow such vehicle to stand upon a highway, road or street, or any place open to the public leaving a child under the age of seven unattended therein, except when another responsible person of at least 12

years of age has immediate control over such child and is physically present in the vehicle.

- B. Penalty for violation of this section: Any person convicted of a violation of this section shall be guilty of criminal misdemeanor and shall be punished by a fine not to exceed \$1,000 or by imprisonment in jail for not more than ninety (90) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment. 9.90.040 Minor misrepresenting age. It is unlawful for any minor to misrepresent his or her age for the purpose of aiding, abetting, or benefitting from any of the acts prohibited in this chapter. (Ord. 1390, 1978; Ord. 1763, 1994)

9.90.060 Violators under eighteen Any persons under the age of eighteen years violating sections of this chapter shall be cited to the Snohomish County juvenile court for investigation, and in the event that persons are remanded to the city authorities by the judge of juvenile court, they may be tried and punished as otherwise provided in this criminal code.
