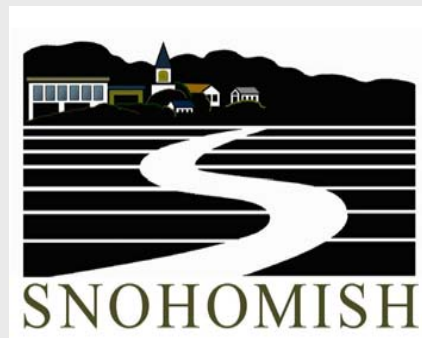

“Common Themes” Map Created April 29th

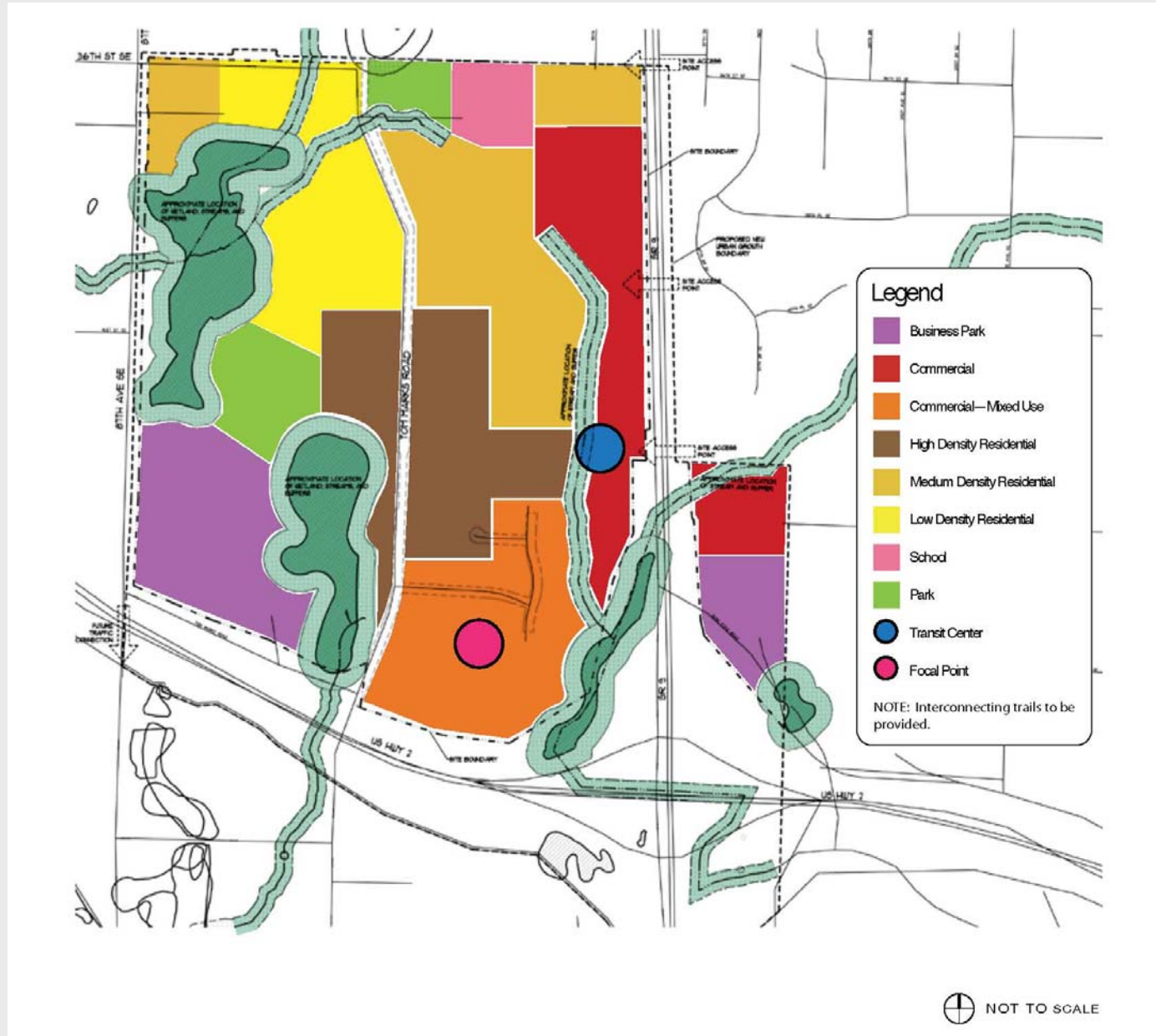
Q1: Common Themes Map consistent with values and goals?

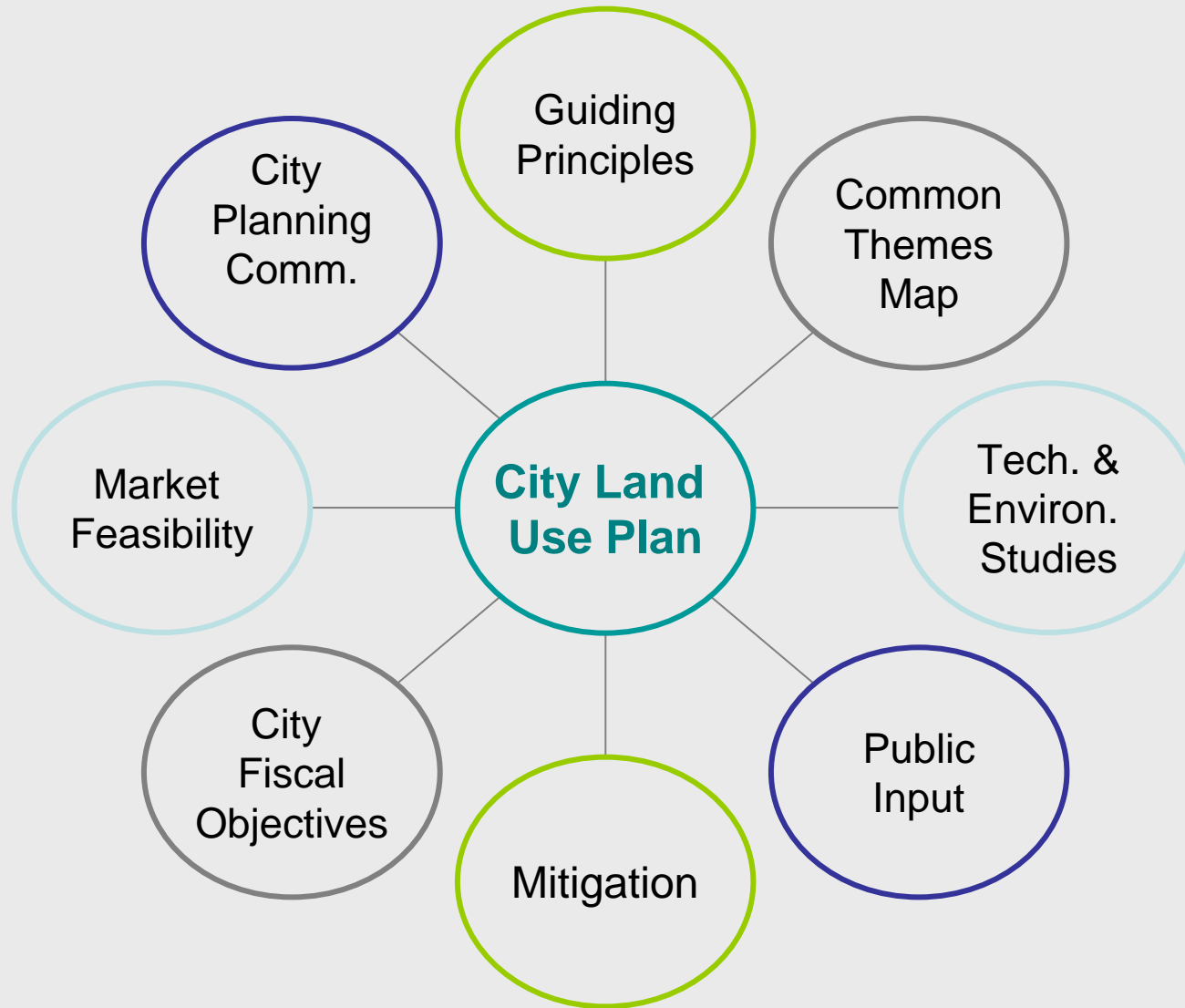
Ways to Avoid Vehicle Miles/Trips

- Pedestrian & bike paths/facilities
- Regional transit center
- Transit-oriented design
- Transit center w/ amenities
- Transportation demand management w/ new development
 - Carpool, vanpool, flex-car
 - Alternative work hours
 - Transit passes for employees
 - Showers/lockers for employees
- Create employment, retail & service destinations here
- Mixed-use & live-work buildings
